Recycling & General Waste Bin Collection

Your recycling collection will occur on the same day as your general waste collection.

You will need to know what Zone you are in. Zones are as follows:

	Zone 1 – Lancelin
	Zone 2 – Ledge Point
	Zone 3 – Gingin townsite and properties East of Brand Highway (including Lennard Brook)
	Zone 4 – Seabird, Guilderton, Gingin Brook Road and all properties West of Brand Highway (including Beermullah, Wanerie, Muckenburra, Neergabby and Yeal) but EXCLUDING the Rural Estates below
	Zone 5 – Ocean Farm, Seaview Park, Sovereign Hill, Redfield Park, Woodridge



Your general waste bin (red-topped) is collected weekly.



Your recycling bin (yellow-topped) is collected fortnightly – please check the cover for your date.

Waste Management Facilities

The Shire of Gingin has three waste management facilities all of which are Category 64 Class II Waste Management Facilities

Residential Waste and Tip Passes

- Tip passes are provided annually with your Rate Notice.
- Please take the time to read the conditions on your Tip Pass to avoid any unnecessary fees on arrival at the Shire's landfill sites.
- The tip pass is not valid for commercial/business waste – fees and charges apply. Visit the Shire's website for full details: **www.gingin.wa.gov.au/council/fees-charges**.
- Costs will also apply for disposal of some wastes including asbestos, tyres, more than 30L of waste oil and animal bodies.
- All waste that has a charge associated with its disposal must be paid for at the gatehouse before exiting. EFTPOS facilities are available at all landfills.
- The Shire of Gingin can offer the service of an account for large operators. All accounts must be applied for and approved before any waste will be accepted under the terms of the Shire.
- Lost tip passes are available from the Shire of Gingin office – proof of property ownership and identification is required, and cost to replace is \$30.00.
- Residential waste loads without a valid tip pass will incur a fee.

Liquid Waste Disposal

The Shire of Gingin does not accept septage (the sludge from septic tanks and grease traps) at any of its waste management facilities. Please use a Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) licensed septage pump out service to empty your septic tanks/grease traps. This service provider is required to dispose of septage at approved facilities licensed by DWER.

Recycling at Waste Management Facilities

The Shire of Gingin offers a range of free recycling options at all its waste management facilities. These include:

- Domestic recyclables – glass bottles/jars, cardboard, aluminium and steel cans, and tins
- Scrap steel, de-gassed fridges, car bodies
- Car batteries – wet cell only
- Waste oil – domestic only less than 30L
- E-waste – TVs, computers, laptops, hard drives, printers, faxes, speakers, key boards, telephones, ipods etc.

Fluorescent globes and tubes are now accepted at all landfills.

The Shire also recycles the following for a fee:

- Waste tyres – various sizes (see Shire's Fees and Charges)
- Waste oil – all commercial and domestic waste oil greater than 30L (see Shire's Fees and Charges)
- DrumMuster – is a free service for business that brings in drums that have the DrumMuster logo on them only. It provides recycling of eligible, cleaned, non-returnable chemical containers (1 litre to 205 litre)

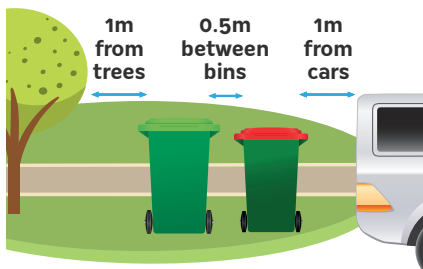

Using Your Bins

BIN PLACEMENT

To assist waste and recycling operators in servicing your bin on collection day:

- Bins should be placed within 1 metre of the road kerb by 6.00am on collection day, with the handles facing towards the property. Ensure your bin does not block footpaths or driveways.
- Place your yellow recycling bin at least half a metre from the red bin to allow clear access for the side loading service vehicle's grab arm.
- Please do not overfill your bin as the rubbish and recycling trucks' hydraulics cannot lift bins weighing over 70kg, or those overfull with the lid open. Hot or burning ash, liquid wastes, oil, paint, solvents or heavy materials must not be placed in your bin as they may damage the bin, waste collection vehicle and the environment.
- Your bin lid must close so that the contents do not spill when it is lifted and so the lid does not blow open causing street litter.
- Place your bin clear of parked cars, trees, poles, etc to allow clear access to the service vehicles.
- Only waste placed inside the bin will be collected.



Ensure bins are placed out by 6am on collection day



Bins must weigh less than 70kg to be collected



Do not overfill your bins and ensure lids are firmly closed so items do not spill out

HANDY HINTS

- Return bins to your property as soon as possible.
- Store bins in a shaded area.
- Please clean your bin regularly.



YOUR RECYCLING BIN (YELLOW-TOPPED)

Contents from your yellow-topped bin, **collected fortnightly**, are sorted and baled at the Regional Resource Recovery Centre (RRRC) and sold for reprocessing.

Items should be LOOSE (not in plastic bags), rinsed and empty.

This includes:

- ✓ **Cardboard** – Flattened
- ✓ **Glass bottles and jars** – Clean and empty
- ✓ **Paper** – Not shredded
- ✓ **Plastic bottles and containers** – Clean and empty (no lids)
- ✓ **Steel and aluminium cans** – Clean and empty

YOUR WASTE BIN (RED-TOPPED)

Contents from your waste bin (red-topped), **collected weekly**, are disposed at a landfill site. To reduce your impact on the environment, please consider composting or worm farming food and garden organics at home. Visit **recycleright.wa.gov.au** for more information on how to get started.

✗ **NO Batteries**

Batteries are accepted at the Gingin, Lancelin and Seabird Landfill sites.

✗ **NO Hazardous waste:** including petrol, gas cylinders, paints, motor oils & fluids, garden chemicals & poisons, pool chemicals, cleaners, aerosol cans, acids, bleaches & ammonia, medicines & flammable liquids.

✗ **NO Medical wastes or needles.**

✗ **NO Construction, demolition & building materials** (including bricks, sand, soil, concrete, rocks and asbestos).

Other Items

AUTOMOTIVE PRODUCTS If you have automotive products (coolants, brake pads, motor oil and tyres), discuss the right way to get rid of them with your mechanic or car service provider.

BOOKS, CLOTHING, FURNITURE, SHOES, BRIC-A-BRAC Please do not throw out household goods. There is a major need for clean, undamaged, reusable furniture which may be collected FREE of charge. Contact your local charity.

COMPACT FLUORESCENT TUBES (CFL) recycling boxes are available at each of the landfill sites.

COMPUTERS AND IT Old computer and IT equipment can be dropped off at Gingin, Lancelin and Seabird landfill sites for recycling.

GAS BOTTLES For LPG refills and disposals, return to your bottle supplier. HHW drop off facilities will accept unwanted or out of date BBQ cylinders.

HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES Can be deposited at the landfill facilities for recycling.

NEEDLES Place needles in a sealed sharps container. Visit safesharps.org.au to find your nearest disposal location.

OLD MEDICINES If you have leftover medicines, enquire at your local pharmacy as many pharmacies can dispose of them properly through the RUM project.

PLASTIC BAGS

A good way to avoid plastic bags is by taking your own reusable shopping bags to the shops.

If you wish to recycle plastic bags and other soft or scrunchable plastics, these can be recycled as part of the REDcycle program at local shopping centres. For more info, visit redcycle.net.au

The 3 R's – reduce, reuse and recycle – are a simple way to rethink the things that you no longer need and make a difference today!

EASY TIPS FOR BETTER RECYCLING:



In the **yellow-topped bin** you can place:

Cardboard – Flattened

Glass bottles and jars – Clean and empty

Paper – Not shredded

Plastic bottles and containers – Clean and empty (no lids)

Steel and aluminium cans – Clean and empty

Place items loosely in the bin, this helps with the sorting process at the Regional Resource Recovery Centre (RRRC).

Before placing anything in either bin, ask yourself if it can be reused. It's better to reuse before recycling.



The **red-topped bin** is for general household waste, including kitchen scraps and garden clippings.

Alternatively, kitchen scraps and garden clippings can be composted or used in a worm farm at home, keeping valuable resources out of landfill and producing compost that is great for your garden.

Some things should not go in either bin, such as batteries, electronic devices or e-waste, or hazardous household waste. Disposal options for these are given in this calendar.
